



Was begun in 1793. It houses the chambers of the Senate and the House of Representatives.



Make as many copies of the timeline as you will need. Cut out the figures and store in a zip-lock bag. Glue the figures onto the timeline.







#### **Timeline Markers**

Cut out the markers. Store in a zip-lock bag. Glue onto the timeline as you study.












